The process of admission for the academic session of 2024-25 of Haldia Government College will be entirely online vide the *GO No. 554-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14 dated 21.08.2024*. The procedure of online application and admission to be followed in the online admission process is stated below: -

1. Applications are to be submitted online within the dates as announced separately in this notification.
2. After the last date of submission of online application, the date on which the first provisional merit list of the applicants ranked on the basis of merit that will be published at the admission portal/college website, is announced separately in this notification.
3. Complaint regarding non-inclusion of name in the provisional merit list or other discrepancies should be lodged through online mode using specified format within a stipulated time span. These dates are announced separately in this notification.
4. The date on which the final merit list will be published and the admission process for those merit listed applicants is announced separately in this notification.
5. For each phase of e-Admission, a stipulated time span will be given during which an applicant listed in the particular merit list must take admission and make the online payment of the admission fees through the link of payment given in the admission web-portal.
6. If any applicant enlisted in any merit list does not take e-Admission and make the e-payment within the scheduled time span as announced no further chance of admission can be given to him/her because in on-line admission system after the closure of the admission date and time the next candidate on the next merit list will be given the scope of admission.
7. All applicants are directed to keep continuous touch with the college website/ admission web portal for getting the updated information.



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8. It is to be noted carefully that the applicants for admission are not allowed to come to the college for any enquiry or for any other purpose from the beginning to the end of the admission process. They are to report to the college on the date of commencement of classes, to be announced later on in the college website with all testimonials and documents in original and a photo copy of each document for verification and other documents as given in the admission notice.
9. For any help prospective applicant/ applicants may contact admin of web-portal or they can also contact to the Admission Committee (9433578859/9143242779) from **10:00 AM to 5:00 PM**). 10. Admission to all programmes will be done strictly on the basis of merit as per the State Government Order. Reservation of seats will be strictly abided by the reservation policy of the State Government.
11. All admissions done through online system are absolutely provisional. Admission will be cancelled out-rightly if the information stated in the application are found not in conformity with the documents submitted at the time of verification or any fake document is produced. Therefore, all applicants are requested to be very careful at the time of submission of information submitted in the admission web-portal of the college.
12. The subject wise and category wise seat capacity/matrix is also stated separately in this notice notification.
13. All applicants getting the scope of admission must submit the anti-ragging affidavit, the link for which will be given in the college website/ admission web portal. A print out of the anti- ragging affidavit submitted online is to be taken and it is to be handed over to the Admission Committee on the date of commencement of class.
14. If any student admitted under the online system does not report for verification on the date of commencement of class or continuously remain absent for



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two weeks without any intimation to the college authority his/ her admission will be cancelled.

15. All applicants are hereby instructed to be honest to declare at the time of online admission whether he/she already took admission to any other college/ institution. He/ She will be given the chance of admission subject to the fulfillment of the condition that he/she takes cancellation statement from the previous college/ institution and sent the scanned copy of the same within 7 days of the date of admission. He/ She must submit the hard copy of the cancellation statement/Transfer certificate to the admission committee on the date of verification documents. It is expected that the student will not book the seats in more than one college at the same time.

**❖ GENERAL DIRECTION TO THE APPLICANTS FOR ONLINE APPLICATION**

1. Applicants should register in the online admission portal <https://hgc.collegeadmission.org.in> They should remember their user id, password, registered mobile number, Roll No. / Registration No. / Unique No. in 10+2 and email id. All these parameters would be required if the applicant is selected for admission after generation of merit list.
2. Applicants are advised to make choice of the subjects wisely during application procedure. Random requests for change of subject after initiation of admission procedure may not be entertained by the college authority.
3. Applicants are advised to avoid any typographical error. Any wrong information furnished in the application as a result of typing error may lead to cancellation of the application. The college authority has the right to cancel any application if it is proved to be erroneous during verification. Application not accompanied by proper supporting documents will also be cancelled.



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4. The online Application Fee has been waived off vide Memo. No. **354-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14 dated 02.06.2023** issued by Department of Higher Education, Government of west Bengal.
  5. Applicants seeking admission under reserved categories (SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B, PWD, EWS etc.) must **upload their caste/ disability/EWS certificates** at the time of online application and if enlisted in the provisional merit list and get a chance for admission they must produce the same for verification on the date of commencement of class.
  6. Applicants belonging to Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and enlisted in the provisional merit list must upload the certificate from competent authority at the time of submission of online application and produce the same for verification on the date of commencement of class, if they get the chance of admission.

- ✓ **Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination before 2024 must submit an undertaking stating that he/she has not taken any admission in any other college or not registered to any university. If the candidate is registered to any other University, standard norms of the Vidyasagar University in addition to eligibility criteria of the college will apply for new admission.**

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## **Admission Criteria**

- ❖ Admission criteria, In-take capacity etc. shall be governed according to the guidelines issued by the Government of West Bengal and the Vidyasagar University as applicable time to time. Proposed basic admission criteria applicable only for UG Admission for session 2024-25 with respect to introduction of CCFUP are as follows:
1. Candidates passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission to the undergraduate programmes with Single Major and Multidisciplinary Studies under CCFUP within 4 (four) consecutive academic sessions from the date of passing the qualifying examination.
  2. Candidates passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) from Vocational stream conducted by the respective Board/ Council for vocational studies or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission in the undergraduate programmes in Multidisciplinary Studies only within 4 (four) consecutive academic sessions from the date of passing the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination.
  3. Candidates must have passed in 4 (four) recognized subjects (excluding Environmental Studies) including at least one language subject in the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination.
  4. Students who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with minimum 45% marks in the Aggregate (to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'Best Four' subjects excluding Environmental Studies) along with pass in the subject/related subject or 50% marks in the subject or related subject are eligible to apply for admission in the Single Major (Honours/Honours with Research) programmes.
  5. Students carrying pass marks in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with at least pass in four subjects (excluding Environmental Studies) including at least one language subject in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination are eligible to apply for Multidisciplinary programmes under CCFUP. Students from





Vocational stream are also eligible to apply for Multidisciplinary Studies only after fulfilling the prescribed criteria.

❖ **Other Important Information:**

- i. Any candidate seeking admission to a Programme in laboratory-based subjects must have obtained pass marks in those subjects / relevant subjects at the Higher Secondary or equivalent level.
- ii. In addition to the above, any candidate seeking admission to Single major programme [B.Sc.(H/H&R) MAJOR] in Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Economics must have passed in Mathematics in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination.
- iii. Any candidate seeking admission to Single major programme [(H/H&R) MAJOR] in Anthropology, Economics, Sociology or Statistics and not having these subjects at H.S. or equivalent level, must have any one of the following relevant subjects in Higher Secondary or equivalent course:

- iv. Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination in 2021, 2022 and 2023 are also eligible to apply.
- v. Candidates who have passed 10+2 level examinations from West Bengal Council of Vocational Education and Training Board or Open School are eligible to apply for only Multidisciplinary programmes under CCFUP.
- vi. The candidates who will opt for Physical Education as a general subject will have to pass a qualifying examination after commencement of class. If they fail to qualify the test they will have to opt for other subject.

***N.B.: Admission into any programme under this College is not complete unless and until a candidate is registered under the Vidyasagar University through this College. Any suppression of facts, false statements, if revealed in future will lead to the cancelation of admission.***

## **Merit Point Calculation:**

1. Admission will be done on merit basis and merit point for admission in single major programme is to be calculated by adding 10% of total marks obtained in the best four subjects excluding Environmental Studies including one language subject at Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination and the marks obtained in the subject or related subject in which the admission in single major programme is sought.
2. The merit points for admission to multidisciplinary programme are to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in best four subjects excluding Environmental Studies including one language subject of H.S. / equivalent examination.
3. If any students of Science stream in Higher Secondary/ equivalent examination apply for Single major programme [B.A (H/ H&R) MAJOR] in Bengali/English, his/her merit point is to be calculated proportionately by deducting marks obtained in the practical examination.

**N.B:** Merit point will be calculated as per the similar procedure as follows in **wbcap**.

### **✓ Tie breaking rules-**

#### **For single major:**

1. If more candidates score same merit point, preference will be given to the one who has scored higher marks in the class 10<sup>th</sup> examination.
2. Highest marks obtained in corresponding subject;

**Note:** If an applicant gets admission on the basis of higher marks scored in 10 level Examination, he/ she is to produce the Mark sheet of the said examination at the time of verification of documents on the date of commencement of classes.

#### **For multidisciplinary programmes:**

1. If more candidates score same merit point, preference will be given to the one who has scored higher marks in the class 10<sup>th</sup> examination.
2. Highest marks obtained in English in 10+2 examination.
